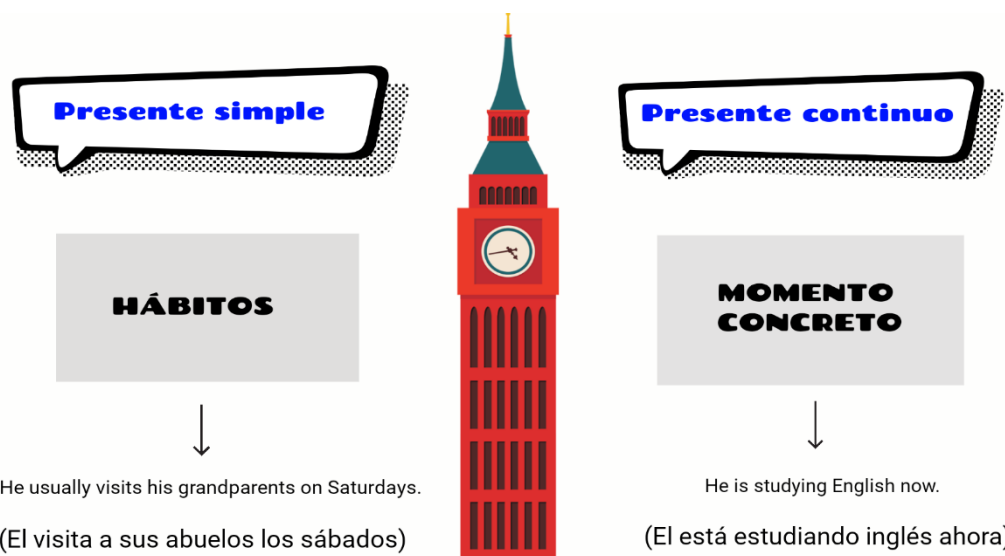

Podemos usar más de un verbo en estas oraciones Cuando queremos acompañar al verbo like con otro verbo debemos hacerlo de la siguiente manera:

1º en infinitivo acompañado de la preposición TO:

I **like to go** to the cinema once a month (Me gusta ir al cine una vez al mes: es una costumbre importante para mí).

2º en gerundio, es decir con la terminación "ing"

I **like going** to the cinema whenever I can (Me gusta ir al cine siempre que puedo: disfruto con ello).

Observemos otro ejemplo:



We sometimes use **like + infinitive** to talk about habits or choices.

Usamos like + infinitivo para hablar sobre hábitos o elecciones.

 I like **to eat** chocolate for breakfast. (my habit)



Like + verb-ing is more common to say you like doing something in general.

Like + ing es más común para hablar sobre cosas que nos gustan o disfrutamos hacer en general.

 I like **eating** chocolate. (I like doing this in general)
