Have got (Affirmative & negative forms)

Affirmative	Negative
<i>I have got = I've got</i>	<i>I have not got = I haven't got</i>
<i>You have got = You've got</i>	<i>You have not got = You haven't got</i>
<i>He has got = He's got</i>	<i>He has not got = He hasn't got</i>
<i>She has got = She's got</i>	<i>She has not got = She hasn't got</i>
<i>It has got = It's got</i>	<i>It has not got = It hasn't got</i>
<i>We have got = We've got</i>	<i>We have not got = We haven't got</i>
<i>You have got = You've got</i>	<i>You have not got = You haven't got</i>
<i>They have got = They've got</i>	<i>They have not got = They haven't got</i>

Joe's a student. ('s = is)
 Joe's dog is brown. ('s = possessive case)
 Joe's got two sisters. ('s = has)

<i>Have we got... ?</i>	Yes, we have. / No, we haven't.

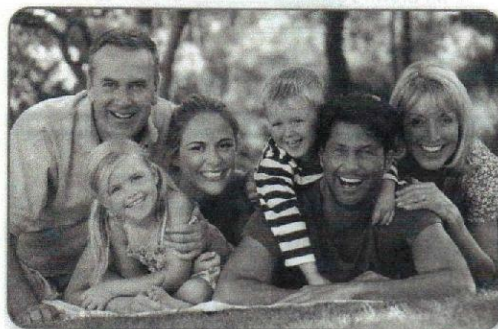

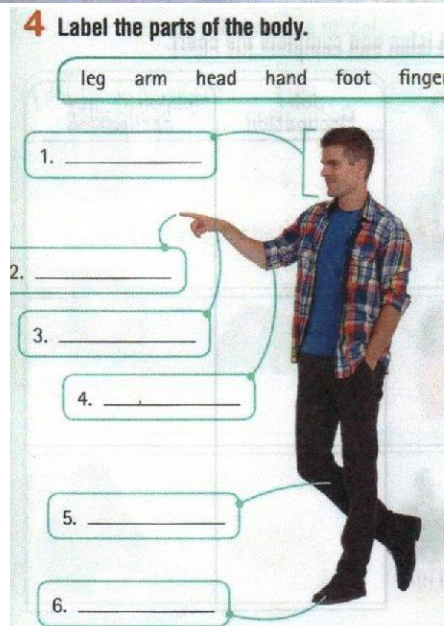
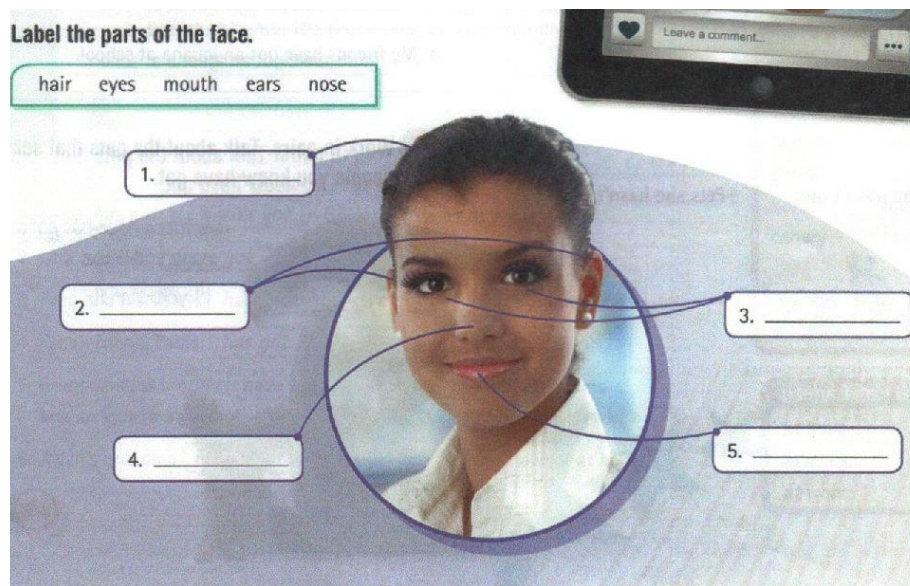
