Guía n°3Actividades para la semana del 20 de abrilExplicación**THERE IS – THERE ARE (hay)**

There is/there are quiere decir “haber” y se usa para indicar si hay algo o bien la cantidad que hay de algo.

There is es **singular** es decir que lo vamos a usar cuando hay una sola cosa por ejemplo

There is a museum (hay un museo)

There are es **plural** es decir que lo vamos a usar cuando hay dos o, mas cosas por ejemplo

There are two shopping centres (hay dos centros comerciales)

Cuando no sabemos específicamente la cantidad que hay podemos usar **SOME (algunos- algunas) en oraciones afirmativas** por ejemplo: There are **SOME** schools (hay algunas escuelas)

There isn't es el negativo para decir que **NO hay una cosa** por ejemplo

There isn't a club (no hay un club)

There aren't es el negativo para decir que **NO hay dos o mas cosas** por ejemplo

There aren't four cinemas. (no hay cuatro cines)

Cuando no sabemos específicamente la cantidad podemos usar **ANY (algunos-algunas) en oraciones negativas** por ejemplo

There aren't **ANY** supermarkets (no hay algunos supermercados)

Para preguntar si hay una cosa usamos **IS THERE A..?** por ejemplo

Is there a library? Hay una biblioteca?

Para preguntar si hay dos o mas cosas usamos **ARE THERE ANY ...?** Por ejemplo

Are there any houses? Hay algunas casas?


