

Sobre verbos REGULARES e IRREGULARES en el Pasado Simple


La lista de verbos regulares que se presenta en la tabla abajo son solo ejemplos. Hay cientos de verbos regulares y todos se conjugan exactamente de la misma manera. En su forma afirmativa se agrega ED al final del verbo raíz y en la forma negativa e interrogativa se usa el auxiliar DID NOT y DID respectivamente. La lista de verbos irregulares es mucho más corta que la de verbos regulares, la única dificultad es que los verbos IRREGULARES en su forma AFIRMATIVA “cambian completamente” (o sea no llevan ED al final). Mientras que en la forma INTERROGATIVA Y NEGATIVA funcionan igual que los verbos regulares utilizando la forma del verbo raíz con el auxiliar DID, DIDN'T.

Los cambios de los verbos IRREGULARES en la forma afirmativa deben ser memorizados mientras que los verbos REGULARES solo se aplica la regla ED al final.


