Interrogative form (verbo to be)

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Questions	Short answers
Am I ... ?	Yes, I am . / No, I'm not .
Are you ... ?	Yes, you are . / No, you aren't .
Is he ... ?	Yes, he is . / No, he isn't .
Is she ... ?	Yes, she is . / No, she isn't .
Is it ... ?	Yes, it is . / No, it isn't .
Are we ... ?	Yes, we are . / No, we aren't .
Are they ... ?	Yes, they are . / No, they aren't .

Have got / has got (tener)

Grammar

The verb *have got*

Study the forms of the verb *have got*.

	I, you, we, they	she, he, it
affirmative <i>full form</i>	I have got a blue T-shirt.	She has got a green scarf.
<i>short form</i>	I've got a blue T-shirt.	She's got a green scarf.
negative <i>full form</i>	I have not got a red T-shirt.	She has not got a grey scarf.
<i>short form</i>	I haven't got a red T-shirt.	She hasn't got a grey scarf.
interrogative	Q Have you got a white T-shirt? A Yes, I have . or No, I haven't .	Q Has she got a black scarf? A Yes, she has . or No, she hasn't .

✚ We use have / has got to describe people and things.

Usamos have / has got para describir personas y cosas.

I've got short hair.

She's got a big smile.

They've got blue eyes

✚ We also use have / has got to talk about families.

Usamos también, have / has got para hablar sobre familias.

I've got five cousins.

She's got a brother and two sisters.

We've got a big family.

✚ For the negative, we add not (n't) to have / has. Para el negativo agregamos not (n't) para have /has.

I haven't got a brother.

We haven't got a computer.

She hasn't got long hair.

✚ For questions, we move have / has. Para preguntas movemos (adelantamos) have / has.

Have we got any crisps?

Has Bert got a pet?:

Remember:

With short answers, we don't use got. Con respuestas cortas, no usamos got.

Has she got blond hair? Yes, she has.

Have you got a brother ? No, I haven't.

'S sometimes means is and sometimes means has. 'S algunas veces significa is y algunas veces significa has

He's nice = He is nice.

She's a student = She is a student.

He's got Brown hair = He has got brown hair.

She's got three brothers = she has got three brothers.
