Anne's diary became her best friend. Write a diary entry about a day during the Coronavirus (COVID-19) quarantine.

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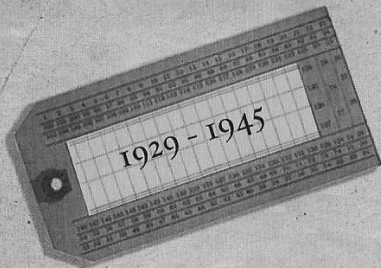

ANNE FRANK



Anne Frank in May 1942



9 Anne Frank was born in Frankfurt-am-Main, Germany. Her family were Jews*, so, in 1933, they moved to Amsterdam to leave the dangers of Hitler's Germany.

Anne was given a red and white diary as a present on her thirteenth birthday. Only a few weeks later, the German army arrived in Holland. Anne and her family had to hide* in secret rooms.

Wednesday 8th July 1942

I knew this was my last night in my own bed, but I slept immediately and didn't wake until Mummy called me at 5.30 the next morning the house wasn't tidy, but it wasn't important. We only wanted to get away, escape*, and stay safe.

In her famous diary, Anne writes about what it is like to hide, worried that someone will find her and her family.

escape run from danger
hide go where no one can find you
Jews group of people who came from the country now called Israel

Anne couldn't always talk to her family about how she was feeling. Her diary became her best friend.

In their secret rooms, Anne and her family had a radio, and they knew what was happening to other Jews.

Saturday 15th
July 1944

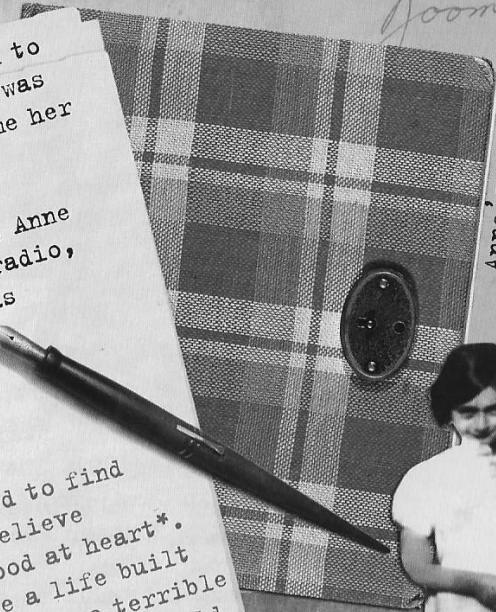
I am surprised to find that I still believe people are good at heart*. I cannot live a life built on bad things. I see terrible things happening in this world, but when I look up at the sky, I feel that everything will be better one day.

The German police found Anne and her family on 4th August 1944. Anne and her sister died in Bergen-Belsen in March 1945. Anne was 15. Anne's father, Otto, did not die in the war. He decided to publish* his daughter's diary, so the world could know what happened to her. (●)
