
Objetivos

EXPLICACION DE TEMA



En el cuadro anterior se explica cómo es la estructura de las preguntas. Siempre comienza con un AUXILIAR (have/has), luego se coloca la PERSONA/PRONOMBRE PERSONAL y luego el verbo en PASADO PARTICIPIO. Son preguntas de RESPUESTA CORTA (yes/no answers)

Por ejemplo: ***Have you done your homework (yet)? Yes, I have./ No, I haven't.***

También hay otras palabras que puedes utilizar a la hora de preguntar y responder; estas son:

- ❖ EVER: para preguntas
- ❖ NEVER: para oraciones afirmativas aunque su significado sea “nunca”.

Ejemplos: ***Have you ever eaten sushi?*** (¿Alguna vez has comido sushi?)

Respuestas posibles: Yes, I have / No, I haven't.

I have never eaten suhi. (Yo nunca he comido sushi)


