PRESENTE SIMPLE

- Hábitos y rutinas	→	Steve goes to school everyday .
- Verdades absolutas	→	Water boils at 100 degrees.
- Situaciones permanentes	→	John works in Iberia.
- Horarios de transportes	→	The train leaves at 7 o'clock

Always, often, usually, occasionally, sometimes, rarely, hardly ever, scarcely, never, every week, once / twice a year, on Wednesdays...

- Afirmativa ⇒ Sujeto + infinitivo ("s/-es /-ies" en 3ºPS) + complementos.
- Negativa ⇒ Sujeto + don't / doesn't + infinitivo + complementos.
- Question ⇒ Do / Does + sujeto + infinitivo + complementos + ?

PRESENT SIMPLE

Habits - routines - permanent situations

Affirmative

- I work **every day** from 8:00 to 5:00 pm
- My son likes (he) comics
- Sara (she) studies at UPB

*es: o - x- sh- ch -s

*Vocal + y: ies

Negative

- I **DON'T** work every day
- My son **DOESN'T** like pizza
- Sara **DOESN'T** study at UPB

- **DO** you work every day
- **DOES** he like comic books?
- **DOES** she study at UPB?

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RULES FOR THE 3RD PERSON SINGULAR (HE / SHE / IT)

In general + s	Verbs ending in conson. + y y + ies	Verbs ending in -o, sh, tch, x, ss + es
work → works	study → studies	go → goes
eat → eats	cry → cries	wash → washes
play → plays	try → tries	watch → watches
swim → swims	spy → spies	mix → mixes
write → writes	fly → flies	kiss → kisses
