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3 Indefinite pronouns with no Pronombres indefinidos con NO

We use no one/nobody, nowhere and nothing with positive verbs, but the meaning is negative: There's nowhere to sit. (= There isn't anywhere to sit.) No one answered the phone.



We don't use two negatives in English:

- X I didn't eat nothing. ✓ I didn't eat anything. X Nobody isn't here. ✓ Nobody is here.

4 Indefinite pronouns with every

We use everyone/everybody, everything and everywhere when we mean 'all people', 'all things' or 'all places':

Everyone in the room stopped speaking. Everybody was very happy with the results. Is everything all right? I want to visit everywhere on the island.
