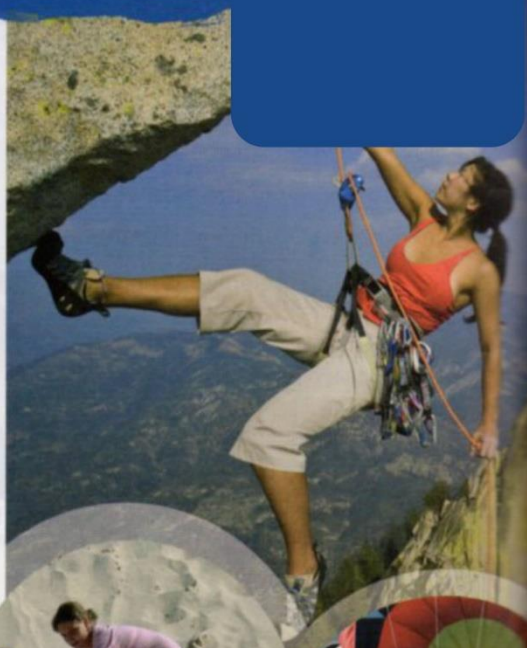
Tahoe Summer Camp is not the typical summer camp: here you don't spend time in your room reading a novel, writing letters home to mum and dad, or doing arts and crafts.

## Simple Past – Irregular Verbs

Do you remember? To form regular verbs in the past, we add **-ed** (*play-played; love-loved; want-wanted*) to the verbs.

However, **irregular verbs** are different and we can find them in a *List of Irregular Verbs* (Check the verb list on page 108).

These are some examples:

Infinitive	Past	Infinitive	Past
be	was / were	know	knew
become	became	make	made
buy	bought	meet	met
fall	fell	say	said
go	went	spend	spent
have	had	take	took
hear	heard	write	wrote

## Past Time Expressions

When we speak in the past, we often use time expressions such as:

*last year / last month / last week  
two days ago / three weeks ago  
yesterday  
the day before yesterday  
this morning*

*Two years ago, I visited New Zealand and I loved it!  
I saw Mrs Jones **this morning**.  
I went to the theatre **yesterday**.*
